# Accredited Grades and the Leaving Cert Exam

Monday 8th March 2021





- We know it has been a difficult time and continues to be an anxious time for everyone

- We still do not have specific details in some areas but it is very positive step that Leaving Certs are back in school



- ALL LC students receive an Accredited Grade
- Student Portal will open on Wed 10<sup>th</sup> March. Portal allows students to opt for Accredited Grade OR Traditional LC exam OR Both
- ISK <u>VERY STRONGLY</u> advises that <u>ALL</u> students opt for BOTH
- Very Simple reason Opting for Both gives students the BEST CHANCE and students maintain an influence on their grades



Opens this Wednesday, the 10th of March at 12.00 noon.

**Step 1** - Create your own account on the portal - you will need your exam number

**Step 2** - To log in you will need your Personal ID number – this is the first 4 digits of your PPSN.

**Step 3** – Make sure your subjects and levels are correct

**Step 4** - Indicate whether you are opting for Examinations, Accredited Grades or both on a subject-by-subject basis.

The Portal will close at 6pm on March 16th.

It will re-open at the end of April/ beginning of May.

At this stage you can change your levels for the subjects and you may opt **out of the exams**.

NOTE: You will not be able to opt into the taking the written exams after the March 16th deadline!!



- Starts from 9<sup>th</sup> June
- Specific details (dates) on each subject regarding practical/coursework has been published
- Orals & Coursework MUST be done if students are sitting exams. If students don't do them – then simply they can't be marked on them

# Practical coursework in these subjects must be returned in hard copy together with the written script and not through the School Portal as previously notified.

#### What is an Accredited Grade?

An SEC Accredited Grade is a grade that can be provided to a student in respect of a subject following the combination by the SEC of a school estimated percentage mark for a student's expected performance in an examination and national data available in relation to the performance of students in examinations over a period of time.

#### Accredited Grades

- All LC students receive an Accredited Grade
- Four steps in the school's role:
- Step 1 Teacher's estimation of student percentage marks
- Step 2 School Alignment for a subject through subject alignment group
- Step 3 Oversight of alignment process by the principal
- Step 4 Transmission of marks for national standardisation
- Out of School Subjects will also be facilitated as in 2020
- Time Frame: Alignment Process 31<sup>st</sup> May 4<sup>th</sup>June



- Results are due in Mid August as usual
- Each student will only get one grade whichever grade is higher, either the Accredited Grade or Traditional LC Grade
- Exams have already been adjusted to account for tuition time lost last year
- Exams will be adjusted further to account for lost time this year. Details will be published on a subject-by-subject basis on the week of March 22<sup>nd</sup>.

## **Appeals**

- Appeals process for students sitting the exam is as per normal
- Appeals process for accredited grades only checks for clerical errors – teacher/school results cannot be appealed.

## Orals

- Orals will be conducted in schools
- During the Easter Holidays Irish week 1 and MFL week 2
- Orals Conducted by a teacher possibly class teacher/departmental colleague/ teacher from other school/ retired teacher & then sent to the SEC to be marked
- Teacher does not mark the Oral SEC does



- Practical / coursework can only go ahead in accordance with Public Health Advice
- Where they can not go ahead, the marking scheme of the Exam will be adjusted to reflect this e.g. Construction Studies

### Music

- Performance component of the exam will be arranged to ensure adherence with public health recommendation
- Will take place on the second week of the Easter Holidays

- No Mocks
- Limited Additional testing by class teachers could occur until 14<sup>th</sup> May



- Great to have the school open again but we want to keep it open
- Please emphasise to your son or daughter the importance of adhering to the guidelines regarding masks, sanitising, one-way systems, physical distancing etc.
- If your son/daughter is displaying any symptoms, err on the side of caution and do not send them to school
